Safari Packing List

A comprehensive checklist of everything you'll need for your adventure in the savannah, with descriptions to help you pack smart

Travel Documents

• Passport (valid for at least 6 months)

Essential for international travel and entry into safari countries.

• Visa (if required)

Check visa requirements well before your trip.

Travel insurance documents

Protect yourself against unexpected emergencies.

• Flight tickets / E-tickets

Keep electronic and printed copies handy.

Safari itinerary and booking confirmations

For smooth check-ins and reference.

• Emergency contact list

Important phone numbers in case of emergency.

• Copies of important documents (digital & printed)

Backup in case originals get lost or stolen.

TClothing

• Lightweight, breathable shirts (long & short sleeve)

Long sleeves protect against sun and mosquitoes; breathable fabric keeps you cool.

Lightweight trousers / safari pants

Comfortable for walking and protect legs from scratches and insects.

• Shorts (modest length)

For hotter parts of the day, but choose modest length for safety.

• Fleece or warm jacket

Early mornings and evenings can be chilly on game drives.

Waterproof jacket or poncho

Sudden rains are common; stay dry and comfortable.

Safari hat or wide-brimmed sun hat

Protects your face and neck from harsh sun.

• Swimsuit

Many lodges have pools to cool off after a hot day.

Sleepwear

Comfortable clothes for nighttime at the lodge or camp.

Underwear and socks (quick-dry preferred)

Quick-dry fabrics are practical for washing on the go.

Comfortable walking shoes / hiking boots

Essential for walking safaris or exploring camps.

• Sandals or flip-flops

Easy to slip on at lodges or camps.

Accessories

Sunglasses (UV-protection)

Protect your eyes from intense sunlight.

Scarf or buff

Helps shield your face from dust on safari drives.

Belt

Practical for securing pants and organizing gear.

• Light daypack or small backpack

Perfect for carrying essentials during game drives.

• Money belt or hidden pouch

Keep valuables safe and secure.

• Sunscreen (SPF 30+)

Strong sun protection is vital in the open savannah.

• Lip balm with SPF

Prevent chapped lips from sun and dry air.

• Insect repellent (DEET or natural alternative)

Essential to avoid mosquito bites and other insects.

Hand sanitizer

Keep hands clean when soap and water aren't available.

Wet wipes / baby wipes

Quick refreshment during long game drives.

• Toothbrush & toothpaste

Basic oral hygiene essentials.

• Shampoo & soap (biodegradable preferred)

Eco-friendly options to protect the environment.

Razor & shaving supplies

For personal grooming.

• Feminine hygiene products

Pack enough for your trip, as availability may be limited.

Prescription medication (with copies of prescriptions)

Bring any personal medications with documentation.

• First-aid kit

Include plasters, antiseptic, painkillers, and any personal needs.

• Malaria tablets (if recommended)

Consult your doctor depending on your safari location.

• Rehydration salts or electrolyte tablets

Help prevent dehydration during hot days.

Electronics

• Camera (DSLR or good phone camera)

Capture your wildlife memories in high quality.

• Extra memory cards

Avoid running out of storage in the middle of your trip.

Binoculars

Essential for spotting distant animals and birds.

• Headlamp or flashlight (with extra batteries)

Useful for night-time walks or camping.

• Universal power adapter

Safari destinations may have different plug types.

• Phone & charger

For communication and emergency use.

Power bank

Keep devices charged when away from power outlets.

Other Essentials

Reusable water bottle

Stay hydrated and reduce plastic waste.

• Travel pillow

For comfort during long drives or flights.

• Travel journal & pen

Record your safari experiences and sightings.

• Guidebook or field guide (animals/birds)

Learn about the wildlife you encounter.

• Snacks (protein bars, dried fruit, nuts)

Handy between meals on game drives.

Ziplock bags

Great for organizing small items and keeping electronics dry.

• Small sewing kit

For minor clothing repairs.

• Lightweight travel towel

Quick-drying and useful for camping or lodge stays.
